
Hartford Police Department 2016 Hartford Mini-Academy Final Report


MINI-ACADEMY ANNUAL ATTENDANCE

This was very advantageous for everyone involved, because law enforcement must work hand in hand with our counterparts in academia to maximize the safety of our students in the learning environment.


